#### FORGIVENESS: GIFT TO RECEIVE AND GIVE

Without the gift of forgiveness, how could we live? "If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with

You." (Psalm 130:3-4a) None of us could possibly stand before the Lord on Judgment Day or any other day apart from His gracious pardon in Jesus Christ. Without the gift of forgiveness, each one of us would be doomed to horrific punishments now and everlasting punishment in hell. That is what our sins deserve.

We cannot thank our Lord enough, then, that He has forgiven all our sins for the sake of Christ's holy life and innocent death in our place. Because of His grace and the saving merits of Jesus Christ, our Father forgets our sins and will not punish us for them as we deserve. This forgiveness is for everyone; Jesus is the Lamb of God who took away the sin of the world. (John 1:29; See also 2 Cor. 5:19 and 1 John 2:2.) Individual sinners receive the gift of forgiveness and personally appropriate its blessings through faith in Jesus Christ. "A man is justified by faith." (Rom. 3:28) And we are justified – declared righteous – by the forgiveness of sins.

The Lord freely gives us His gift of forgiveness, and He expects us to pass it on to others. Jesus' parable of the unforgiving servant (*Matt. 18:21-35*) compares each sinner to a servant who owed his royal master an incredibly huge debt, one the servant could never repay. Our heavenly Father is like that king, who had compassion on the servant and graciously forgave the entire debt. The forgiven servant, however, refused to forgive the comparatively small debt his fellow servant owed him. Therefore the king ordered this unforgiving servant to be handed over to the torturers. Jesus concluded, "So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses."

Holy Scripture abounds with directives to give the gift of forgiveness. "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." (*Eph. 4:32*) "Forgive one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so also you must do." (*Col. 3:12*) And, as we all remember, Jesus taught us to pray to our Father, "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." (*Matt. 6:12*)

Giving the gift of forgiveness means that we will not seek vengeance or try to get even. We will not speak evil to the offending person or about that person. We will not dwell on his sin and keep bringing it up. We will not give the person "the cold shoulder," or maintain a hostile attitude toward him. Instead, we will try to forget the offense, speak kindly to and about the person, and seek to treat him in a way that demonstrates Christian love and respect. We confess it like this in our Small Catechism in the meaning of the 5<sup>th</sup> Petition of the Lord's Prayer: "So we too will sincerely forgive and gladly do good to those who sin against us."

Refusal to give the gift of forgiveness shows that a person does not truly believe that God has forgiven him, or if he says he believes it, it means nothing to him. Unwillingness to forgive others is a sign of impenitence, which forfeits the Lord's gift of forgiveness. Giving the gift of forgiveness, on the other hand, is an outward sign that we have the Lord's forgiveness and sincerely believe it. Our Large Catechism says, "But if you forgive, you have the comfort and assurance that you are forgiven in heaven – not on account of your forgiving, for God does it altogether freely, out of pure grace, because He has promised it, as the Gospel teaches." (LC, LP:95-96)

If we ever find ourselves willing to give the gift of forgiveness, but struggling to do so because we still feel the hurt of the offense, our Lord invites us to come to Him for help. He would have us honestly admit and confess our own offenses against Him and others, and receive His gift of forgiveness regularly through His gospel word, including the word of Holy Absolution. Receiving God's gift of forgiveness gives us both the will and the strength to forgive others. God would also have us seek His help in prayer, asking Him to work in us so that we may lovingly extend His gift of forgiveness to those who have wronged us. God is merciful and faithful, and He will help us in this.

Brothers and sisters, to receive and gift the gift of forgiveness is simply to be a Christian. May we always live in this gift, then, both receiving and giving, with all the glory and thanks to our gracious Lord!

#### HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY June 9, 2019

President Ron Reising called the meeting to order. Pastor Bishop opened with a prayer.

<u>Parish Report</u> – The Parish Report for April 2019 was reviewed. There were no additions or corrections. Tom Ivey made a motion to approve the April 2019 Parish Report. Ray Barnes seconded the motion. The motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Daryl Dagit presented the May 2019 Treasurer's Report. There were no additions or corrections. Tom Ivey made a motion to accept the May 2019 Treasurer's Report. Don Schoedel seconded the motion. The motion passed. Ray Barnes made a motion to accept the April 2019 Treasurer's Report. Randy Couch seconded the motion. The motion passed.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Dave Kesselmeyer reported that Trustees received two bids for the parking lot repaving project. The Trustees recommend accepting the Perdue Pavement bid of \$3,373, which will cover the filling of cracks, recoating and restriping for the church's big parking lot, triangle lot and driveway. Dave Drockelman made a motion to accept the Purdue Pavement bid of \$3,373. Ross Gould seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Dave Kesselmeyer said the Trustees also received a bid from Western Specialty Roofing to repair the roof leak above the church's sanctuary. The bid is for time and material not to exceed \$1,600. Don Schoedel made a motion to accept the Western Specialty Roofing bid. Howie Proehl seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Dave Kesselmeyer also stated that the Trustees donated the church's old copier to Good Shepherd Lutheran School after the church office recently received a new copier (which is being leased).

Board of Elders – Randy Couch reported that an adult class of four individuals is scheduled to be welcomed into the church's membership on June 16th. Three of those new members will be baptized. Looking ahead: Pastor Bishop will be using vacation time June 6-8, June 10-12 and July 20-29. Two other pastors will fill in on the Sundays Pastor Bishop will be gone.

Board of Finance – No report.

Board of Christian Education - No report.

<u>Board of Worship</u> – Mike Nauth reported that the church still needs additional ushers. Also, the Board of Worship is looking into replacing some banners.

Board of Evangelism – No report.

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – No report (did not meet during the previous month).

<u>Long-Range Planning Committee</u> – The committee will meet on June 10 at 7:00 p.m. The constitution is still under review.

Educational Grand Fund Committee - No report

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – It was reported that new drainage was addressed.

<u>Unfinished Business</u> – Tom Ivey made a motion to dispense with Voters Assembly meetings in July and August. Nancy Drockelman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

New Business – Daryl Dagit made a motion to return Voters Assembly meetings to Monday evenings. Ross Gould seconded the motion. A discussion ensued and President Ron Reising asked meeting attendees to vote on the standing motion by a show of hands. Eleven of those present voted for Monday meetings and nine voted for Sunday meetings. Therefore, the motion passed. The next meeting will be held on Monday, September 9, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

President Reising encouraged everyone in the room to bring another member to the next Voters Assembly meeting in order to increase attendance. He also encouraged everyone to feel free to speak up and ask questions at future meetings.

Valerie Ferguson suggested publishing the agenda prior to each Voters Assembly meeting to let church members know what will be discussed.

President Reising said he would like to see all board members and committee heads attend each Voters Assembly meeting. He also mentioned the advantages of having a monthly Voters Assembly meeting.

Sandy Ferguson said she received a phone call from LifeTouch. The photography company wants to know if our church would like to create a new church directory, to replace the one that completed five years ago. President Reising proposed that this subject should be voted on after the summer months. No one opposed this suggestion.

Dave Kesselmeyer asked Tracy Glass, St. John's Membership Secretary, if she can possibly provide a report on activities completed each month by including that information in the church's parish report. Tracy agreed to do this going forward.

A question was raised about how many people listen to the weekly radio broadcasts of Sunday services. Pastor Bishop stated that he does hear, from time to time, that someone mentioned they listened to a Sunday broadcast. He went on to say that, unfortunately, there is no way to measure listenership.

President Reising suggested having Pastor Bishop re-record the taped portion that is played during each Sunday broadcast in order to include a mention of the church's phone number. Pastor Bishop agreed to look into that possibility.

At President Reising's request, Sandy Ferguson agreed to place an update about radio broadcast contributions in the next monthly newsletter.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
