WHAT WILL BE CENTRAL IN YOUR CHRISTMAS?

Some time ago I heard a conversation on a radio talk show that I thought was both interesting and sad. A man called in and expressed concern over what he considered a tense family situation. He had taught his young children that Santa Claus was real, but his step children, who were older, did not believe in him. So when the step children came to visit, it caused a problem, because they told their younger step siblings that Santa was fake. The father didn't know what to do about this.

To the credit of the radio show hostess, who isn't even a Christian, by the way, she suggested that the man not be concerned about Santa Claus, but that he refocus their attention on what Christmas is supposed to be about, namely, the birth of Jesus Christ. My reaction was obviously, "Well, of course! What else would be central in Christmas, if not the good news of our Savior's birth? What a foolish man to be so concerned about such petty nonsense, instead of the one important thing!"

But then I thought to myself, "Are we really all that much different?" Are *you* all that much different? No, you probably don't make a big issue about what your children or grandchildren think about Santa Claus. But is the birth of Jesus truly central in your Christmas observance?

It's a question worth pondering. Yes, we all know the main focus of Christmas: the glad tidings of great joy that unto us has been born a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. But is that central Christmas truth a message to which we pay mere lip service, or is it good news that actually changes and orders our lives?

Ask yourself these questions: Will our family ar-

range our schedules around Christ this Advent and Christmas? Or will we simply try to "work Him in" whenever it's convenient? Will our conversations and activities reflect the value we place on Jesus? Or will they suggest that shopping and decorating and other activities have priority over Christ? In all honesty, what will be central in our Christmas?

This year's Advent midweek sermon series is titled, "Oh, Come." The sermons are based on Scriptures that gave rise to three liturgical verses for Advent called the "O Antiphons." Each antiphon addresses Jesus by a particular Messianic title from the Scriptures. The great Advent hymn, "Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel" is based on these antiphons. The preaching of these Scriptures will most certainly direct our attention to Jesus Christ, to help prepare us for a Christmas that is truly centered on Him.

May we all show we truly believe what is central in Christmas by taking time to come to the Lord's house and listen to Jesus as He speaks to us through His word, and then respond to Him in prayer and praise. Otherwise we might as well worry about Santa Claus!


