God's Word is our great heritage
And shall be ours forever;
To spread its light from age to age
Shall be our chief endeavor.
Through life it guides our way, In death it is our stay.
Lord, grant while worlds endure,
We keep its teachings pure
Throughout all generations. Amen.
(The Lutheran Hymnal 283)

This beloved hymn declares the truth. God's Word *is* the great heritage of Christians, because it is the Word from our Savior and about our Savior, Jesus Christ. It is His gift to us – an inheritance passed down through the church throughout the ages. "Our fathers have told us... the glorious deeds of the Lord. ...He commanded our fathers to teach them to their children, that the next generation might know them." (from Psalm 78:3-5)

God's Word shall indeed last forever. It shall be our great heritage for as long as people live on this earth. "Heaven and earth shall pass away," Jesus said, "but My words shall never pass away." (Matthew 24:35)

Our chief endeavor – the mission of the church – truly is to spread the light of the divine Word from age to age for the salvation of sinners. For God's Word is the saving light of Jesus, who is the Light. "In Him was life, and the life was the light of men." (John 1:4)

God's Word really does guide our way. It teaches us the good precepts of God, which make our lives more pleasant here on earth, and teach us to be more and more like our loving Creator. Most importantly, His Word points us to Jesus, who is our only Way to heaven. "I am the way and the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father except by Me." (John 14:6)

God's Word is also our stay in death. It holds before us the happy promise of the resurrection of the dead and life everlasting for those who believe in Jesus. "I died, but behold, I am alive fore evermore, and I have the keys of death and Hades." (Revelation 1:18) And

our Savior will rescue us from both!

Finally, as we do in this hymn, we should pray regularly that we keep the teachings of God's Word pure. For these are the teachings that bestow life! And when the teachings of God's Word are changed and corrupted, they are no longer the doctrine of God, but of men. And "anyone who goes ahead and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God." (2 John 9)

As we enter into another Lenten season at the end of this month, (Ash Wednesday is February 26,) let's make it a period of meaningful spiritual renewal by rededicating ourselves to this great heritage of God's Word. You can do so by:

- Attending all the services of God's house you possibly can, including our Wednesday evening Lenten midweek services, to hear God's Word.
- Becoming active or remaining active in one of our Bible studies to grow in God's Word.
- Reading the Bible and good devotional materials (Small Catechism, Hymnal, Portals of Prayer, for example) to be nourished by God's Word also at home.

A heritage unused is a heritage wasted. For your present and everlasting blessing, make full use of God's Word! The more you do, the more you will be thankful for it.

An inquiry was made as to the salary and it was noted that those discussions had already taken place and budgeted.

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- · Fabric should have no stains or holes.
- Pieces do not need to match in size or color/pattern as long as they fit into one of the three size options.
- Each spool of thread should match one of the pieces of fabric included. Neutral thread is also a good option.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH FABRIC KIT

TWO spools of neutral-colored, general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each

TWO pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits of 100% polyester). Each piece should match one of the sizes below:

- 2 ¼ yards of 60" wide fabric
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric
