COMFORTING CONSTANTS IN CHANGED TIMES

The weeks since mid-March have been quite different, to say the least! The COVID-19 pandemic has brought many changes to our everyday lives – many of which are inconvenient, some even annoying. Restaurants are closed for dining in. Schools are operating remotely. Stores

and businesses deemed non-essential are closed, and certain products are unavailable even at the stores that are open. Stores that are open have shopping aisles marked with one-way arrows. Churches are not permitted to conduct regular services. Citizens have been ordered to stay home most of the time. When we do go out, we are to wear face masks and stay at least six feet apart from other people. No doubt, these have been different times.

In these changed times it is great to know *the most important things have not changed*! Our gracious God sets our hearts at rest with His comforting constants. Here are a few constants for us to ponder with grateful hearts:

God Himself remains constant. His essence and character – who He is and what He is like – never change. God Himself declares as much. "I am the LORD; I do not change." (Malachi 3:6) That means God remains good and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, as He describes Himself. And this constant God is constantly with us, always present to do us good.

In the same way, God's promise to hear and answer our prayers is constant. He who is ever present is ever accessible and ever willing to listen to us and help us. Our Lord Jesus promised, "Truly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you." (John 16:23) God also says, "Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify Me." (Psalm 50:15) God's gifts of the privilege and promise of prayer will never change.

Neither will the power of His word, which is another constant. God's word is always living and active, with the power to accomplish what it declares. His gospel word, the good news of forgiveness and everlasting life in Jesus Christ, is "the power of God unto salvation for everyone who believes." (Romans 1:16) God's word has power to deliver salvation to believers, and to strengthen believers in that salvation. God's constant word will sustain our faith in Jesus Christ, even when we Christians must be apart for a time.

God's promises to sustain us and provide for our needs are constant, as well. When certain products are in short supply, when groceries and other items may be less convenient to obtain, we have the constant assurance our God will provide everything we need. Jesus reminds us, when we seek first His kingdom and righteousness, all the other necessities of life will be added to us. The Lord also declares, "My God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19)

Here's another constant gift from God: our Christian hope. Because the object of our hope is certain and constant – God's promise of the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come – our hope is certain and constant. God's word uses the imagery of an anchor to describe the constancy of our Christian hope. "We have this hope as an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast, and which enters the Presence behind the veil." (Hebrews 6:19) Our hope is anchored firmly in the flesh of Jesus Christ, who entered the heavenly Presence on our behalf by all His saving work. So our resurrection from the dead to everlasting glory is certain. That will never change!

Fellow Christians, not only in these different times, but in *all* times, let God's constants fill you with the comfort and peace He alone can give.

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY May 11, 2020

Randy Couch called the meeting to order until President Ron Reising could join the call. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

A motion was made by Debby Dant, seconded by Randy Couch, to approve the April 2020 minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Daryl Dagit presented the March 2020 Treasurer's Report. The April report is not yet available. It was indicated that the funds from the PPP loan/grant were not included in the March report. Gary Pool moved, seconded by Nancy Drockelman, to approve the March 2020 Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Gary Pool provided an update. The board has not met yet. Discussions on the estimates for the masonry repair have been postponed until church resumes so they can be discussed.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Dave Drockelman reported that the Board of Elders have not met yet, but thought there is a meeting scheduled for this coming Saturday, May 16th. (Per Pastor Bishop, in actuality the Elders have agreed to hold a meeting in May, but have not yet established a firm date and time.)

<u>Board of Finance</u> – No report. Nancy Drockelman indicated that there were no updates at this time.

<u>Board of Christian Education</u> – Leslie Hauk indicated that the committee has not met recently.

Board of Worship – Valerie Ferguson reported that the board met on the 7th of May while practicing social distancing. The committee started discussions on communion procedures for when we can reconvene. One option would be a walk-through communion. Initially complete services would be printed in the bulletin so people would not have to touch the hymnals. The committee also started talks about what has been done well in the past and what can be improved in the future. This topic will be the agenda for the next meeting. Ron indicated that he has also had discussions with Pastor about seating in the church in the future.

<u>Board of Evangelism</u> – Debby Dant reported that they have not held meetings. There are 2 events coming up in the future that are on hold until further guidance is given as to whether the events can be held. These would be the booth at the Marigold Festival and Friendship Sunday.

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – Brian Ford indicated that they are putting together a letter to send to the congregation on stewardship. This will let people know that even though

we are unable to hold regular services at the current time, there are still expenses being incurred each month. The letter will indicate that donations can still be sent in even though we are not currently physically attending the services.

<u>Long Range Planning Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Educational Grant Fund Committee</u> – No report.

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Constitution By-laws Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Unfinished business</u> – No unfinished business reported.

New business – Randy Couch indicated that we need to find out when we can start meeting again. He has contacted the district asking them to see what can be done. He has not gotten a response back yet. Also, the idea has been discussed about possibly having 10 people seated in the sanctuary, 10 people in the chapel, 10 people in the gym, etc., in order to achieve social distancing. Randy indicated that Pastor also indicated that maybe he could do several abbreviated services but all this would need to be discussed before any further action could be taken.

Debby Dant brought up the issue that over the past several months there seems to be a lack of reaching out to the elderly in our congregation to see how they are doing. There have been no calls, cards, or inquiries as to whether there is something that they might need. She was wondering how many of the elderly members have not been contacted by someone from the congregation. This is disappointing and Ron indicated that he will bring this up on Saturday at the Elders meetings. Ron noted that he knows that other churches do this. Valerie Ferguson indicated that this is something that is doable and if we know who needs to be contacted, those names could be split among people to take care of this. (Pastor Bishop has continued his regular monthly visits to our shut-in members and to other elderly members by telephone devotions, and in cases where telephone contact is not possible, by printed devotions, throughout the time of the COVID-19 shut down, and will continue to do so.)

Tracy Glass presented a question as to whether the church has been, or will be, cleaned and sanitized. Gary Pool indicated that the trustees have discussed about having professional cleaners, in addition to the regular cleaning service, or whether we would try to clean it ourselves. Further discussion is needed but Daryl indicated that Ross and the trustees have already gotten some bids, which are quite expensive, and have talked with the CDC. Gary indicated that the trustees are aware that the practice of cleaning the church will change permanently in the future.

Ron brought up that it would be nice for the boards to have meetings in person if they can do so with social distancing.

Ron indicated that the June meeting will also be a Zoom meeting to be held on the second Monday of the month. Daryl will set up the meeting.

A motion was made by Randy Couch, seconded by Daryl Dagit, to adjourn the meeting which closed with the Lord's Prayer.

- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
