"I just don't have time." How many times have you found yourself saying that? It's a common complaint. Most of us are very busy people. We have

so much work or home work or so many other important (or *seemingly* important) activities to attend to that it often seems there just aren't enough hours in the day to fit it all in. If only we had more time!

When we think about it more carefully, however, we come to the realization that *all of us have exactly the same amount of time*! It's true, of course, that different people have different responsibilities and commitments that make a claim on their time. But we all have the same twenty-four hours each day in which to accomplish whatever it is we choose to do.

And that's the key word, isn't it? *Choose.* Having enough time for what is important is a matter of our choosing – a matter of setting priorities. And the fact that our time here on earth is limited ought to help us choose our priorities wisely.

For none of us knows the time of his or her death. We only know it could come at *any* time. "Lord, remember how short my time is," we pray in Psalm 89:47. Through His servant James, our Lord also reminds us that we do not even know what will happen tomorrow. "What is your life?" he asks. "You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes." *James 4:14* Jesus' story of the Rich Fool likewise reminds us that our time on earth could expire at any moment. (Luke 12:16-21)

Therefore we must take the time now to be prepared! We learn from Moses to pray: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Psalm 90:12 When the Lord gives us a heart of wisdom — a heart that recognizes our mortality, we take care that we don't spend so much time on the many activities that have value only for this life, that we neglect those activities that prepare us for the life of the world to come.

The person with a heart of wisdom therefore sets aside ample time to be in the Word of God, to receive Holy Absolution, and to partake in the Lord's Supper. Such a person sets aside time for regular daily prayer to the Lord. The wise person *does have time* for these things, because he or she sets them as priorities.


Furthermore, we don't know the time of Jesus' return. Paul wrote, "What I mean brothers, is that the time is short. For this world in its present form is passing away." *I Corinthians* 7:29,31 Judgment Day could be upon us at any time.

Therefore we must do the work of God's kingdom now, proclaiming the good news of Jesus to whomever we can, before it's too late! Jesus told His disciples, "As long as it is day, we must do the work of Him who sent Me. Night is coming, when no one can work." *John 9:4* Knowing that the time of grace could be over any day, we attend to the Lord's mission work today.

The person with a heart of wisdom therefore takes time to teach his or her children or grandchildren about Jesus, to speak of Him to friends, coworkers, and relatives, to invite and bring them to church, and to pray for pastors and missionaries. The wise person *does have time* for these things, because such a person sets them as priorities.

Thank God we can spend our time here on earth in confidence and security, knowing that all our days are under His forgiving grace in Christ. The child of God who has this certainty boldly prays, "I trust in You, O Lord; my times are in Your hands." *Psalm 31:14-15* Yes, our times are in the loving hands of Him who redeemed us for the glorious life of time without end! To Him we gladly commend all our time.

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY February 8, 2021

Mike Nauth called the meeting to order. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

The January Parish report was reviewed. A motion was made by Randy Couch, seconded by Tom Ivey, to accept the report. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Tom Ivey, seconded by Cheryl Ivey, to approve the January meeting minutes. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Daryl Dagit presented the treasurer's report.

A motion was made by Nancy Drockelman, seconded by Cheryl Ivey, to accept the January report. Motion passed.

Board of Trustees — Gary Pool reported that the Trustees met on February 2nd. We have agreed to accept the insurance proposal from Church Mutual Insurance for the property and liability coverage on the church. Church Mutual has a rating of A with AM Best. This will end our agreement with State Farm. Gary thanked Dean Cooper for his past help with our insurance coverage. The new coverage starts on March 1, 2021. Gary also thanked Ross Gould for his work on reviewing our coverage.

Gary indicated that we have approved a bi-annual maintenance agreement with GP Systems in the amount of \$2,687.00 annually. This agreement will provide twiceyearly inspections and service for the heating and cooling systems. The agreement includes 24/7 emergency service without overtime fees and 10% off parts and labor for repairs. Hopefully with the agreement we can do a better job of maintaining the equipment. GP Systems also repaired one of the five rooftop units in January. A draft motor was replaced at a cost of \$977.97. Gary also noted that the rooftop units are old and will need to be replaced at some point. The unit that was recently serviced will need to be replaced soon. Mike Nauth asked if we would use this company to replace the units. Gary indicated that we are not obligated with the agreement to use GP Systems for replacement units and we would probably get bids for the work.

Gary updated the progress on the masonry work. He noted that the work is estimated to be about 70% completed. We have issued payments totaling \$27,750.00 to Midwestern Specialties leaving a balance of \$32,500.00 from the original agreement to be paid. Gary also stated that the work may run into the spring.

In addition, Gary reported that we have accepted the proposal from Comcast for a 5-year extension to the lease agreement for the property on Veterans Drive. This 5-year agreement will begin on August 1, 2021 and continue through July 31, 2026. The annual rent payment for the year 21-22 is \$10,176.40 and will increase 3% annually. The proposal also includes an option for an additional 5-year extension, which would also include the 3%

annual increase.

We recently also replaced 6 emergency light fixtures and the timer for the flagpole light.

The trustees are still seeking a 6th trustee. Gary indicated that if anyone was interested, they should contact one of the trustees.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Del Beideck reported that the Elders have determined the roles of the committee members. Del is Chairman, with Aaron Miller acting as Vice Chairman, and Brian Umbach as Secretary. The Elders continue to progress with their work of contacting members who have not attended church for some time. They are currently contacting members that are 75 and over to reassure them and encourage them to come back to church when they can.

Board of Finance – No report.

Board of Christian Education – Ross Gould reported that Good Shepherd School attendance is up to 139 students, which is an increase of 8 students since the beginning of the school year. Ross also issued a reminder about the Good Shepherd auction and fundraisers that have been printed in the bulletin. In addition, it was noted that interviewing is taking place for several positions.

<u>Board of Worship</u> – Valerie Ferguson reported that they met last week. There will be a quartet from Pekin High that will perform at the 10:30 service on Easter. Ron Reising and Allison Harley are coordinating with the group. Allison is also going to hold a practice of Easter hymns on March 21st between services. Currently a school banner is being displayed in the new addition. In the near future this will be changed to a banner commemorating the dedication of the church.

Board of Evangelism – No report.

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – Sandy Ferguson reported that the board met this evening. They will be sending out a mailing to a certain demographic of people but have not made that decision yet.

Long Range Planning Committee – No report.

Educational Grant Fund Committee - No report.

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – No report.

Constitution By-laws Committee - No report.

<u>Unfinished business</u> – Mike Nauth indicated that the results of the vote from last month's meeting regarding adding a year to the current triennium have been forwarded to the LCMS.

New business – No new business was reported.

A motion was made by Ross Gould, seconded by Julie Wagner, to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
