VII. The Lutheran Church is a liturgical church. Part 2

In this final little article on teachings and practices that are distinctive of the Lutheran Church, we touch on *why* Lutherans continue in the historic western liturgical tradition. Simply put, we retain traditional liturgical forms, not out of mere conservatism, but mainly to preserve the Christ-centered, gospel-focused content of the services, as well as for the sake of reverence and good order.

We learn from the Holy Scriptures that divine service is centered on Jesus Christ and therefore on His gospel message, the good news of salvation by God's grace for the sake of the holy merits of His Son. We see this reflected in our Lord's institution of His Supper, of course, in the sermons recorded in the New Testament, and even in the Biblical description of heavenly worship. For example, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders in heaven sing a new song to the Lamb of God: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, for You were slain, and have redeemed us to God by Your blood out of every tribe and tongue and people and nations." *Revelation 5:9* The worship of heaven focuses on Jesus and His blood-bought gift of redemption.

The retention of traditional liturgical services preserves this Biblical focus on Christ and His gospel. When we observe the main service, for example, we always have confession and absolution, the Kyrie and Gloria in Excelsis with their grace-centered petitions, carefully selected Scripture readings that proclaim the whole counsel of God, the Nicene Creed with its wonderful summary of God's gracious works, the Lord's Supper itself, the Nunc Dimittis with its salvation emphasis, and the Aaronic benediction. This ensures a service centered on Jesus Christ and His saving grace, even if, tragically, the minister would totally "drop the ball" and fail to preach a Christ-centered sermon!

We also learn from the Holy Scriptures, both by the example of God's people and by the Lord's direct command, that worship should be reverent and orderly, not informal and disorganized. Certainly the prescribed sacrificial services of the tabernacle and temple were very reverent and done according to good order. And the Lord directly declares through His apostle what He expects to happen in church: "Let all things be done decently and in order." *1 Corinthians 14:40*

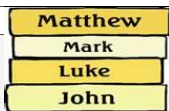
The historic liturgies of the church help promote reverence and good order. When the minister leads the service in a competent and dignified manner, and when the congregation participates accordingly, traditional liturgical services are profoundly reverent and orderly. There is no silliness or frivolity. The worshipers know what is happening and therefore can worship with their heart and soul, since they're not constantly trying to figure out what's going on, or what they are supposed to be doing or saying. There is neither the tyranny of one leader trying to impose on the congregation his own homemade services with their potential errors and omissions, nor the chaos of everybody wanting to say and do their own thing. There is God-pleasing reverence and dignity, for "God is not the author of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints." *1 Corinthians 14:33*

Our Lutheran Confessions declare our desire to maintain gospel-centered services. "After all, the chief purpose of all ceremonies is to teach the people what they need to know about Christ." *Augsburg Confession XXIV:3* Again, "Thus the service and worship of the gospel is to receive good things from God, while the worship of the law is to offer and present our goods to God." *Apology (Defense) of the Augsburg Confession IV:310*

Our Confessions also state our understanding of the value of reverent, orderly worship. "However, it can readily be judged that nothing contributes so much to the maintenance of dignity in public worship and the cultivation of reverence and devotion among the people as the proper observance of ceremonies in the churches." *Augsburg Confession, Articles of Abuses Corrected:6*

Here is another: "Although the holy Fathers themselves had rites and traditions, they did not regard them as useful or necessary for justification. They did not obscure the glory or work of Christ but taught that we are justified by faith for Christ's sake, not for the sake of these human rites. They observed these human rites because they were profitable for

PHOTO DIRECTORY ANNOUNCEMENT

Our church is planning a new photo directory, and we look forward to having all members participate!

Lifetouch, the photo-directory company we worked with in the past, is no longer in business. However, we are blessed to know a retired LCMS Lutheran pastor who specializes in portrait photography and church-directory design. His name is Rev. Robert Bruer, Emeritus, he is located in Decatur, and he has agreed to manage our church directory project.



Pastor Bruer's involvement brings special benefits: simple, quick photo sittings (about 10 minutes per sitting), expert photo retouching, affordable photo-print prices, and no pressure to buy anything (i.e., no hard-sell tactics to buy expensive packages or add-ons, which are often heavily promoted and pushed by commercial portrait companies).

WHEN: Portrait sessions will take place on two consecutive Saturdays: October 11 and October 18.

Signup sheets will be posted in the church gym sometime in September.

(Can't come on a Saturday due to work obligations? See the note at the bottom of this page.)

WHERE: Portrait sessions will take place at our church. During each individual session, participants will be guided into a comfortable pose, a photo will be taken, and the photo will appear on a monitor for instant review.

WHAT: Each individual, couple or family that has a portrait taken will receive one FREE photo directory... and will also be able to order and pay for affordable photo prints in various sizes. (Order forms will be provided ahead of time and also on portrait-session days.)

TIPS FOR GETTING READY ON PICTURE DAY

Clothing — Plan your outfit ahead of time. Solid colors work best. Avoid busy patterns and prominent logos. And choose a color theme that unifies the look of your family.

Accessories — Try to minimize jewelry, or opt for classic, subtle pieces that complement your look.

Makeup — Wear the same amount you normally wear.

Eyeglasses — If you wear eyeglasses all the time, wear them in your portrait. That's the real you!

Pekin St. John's Church Survey Announcement

The LCMS Office of National Mission (ONM) developed and supports a survey-based self-assessment tool for LCMS congregations in the Central Illinois District (CID) which provides a consistent and objective way of answering the question "Where are we... really?" It's called the Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status (CADDs).

At the March and April Voter's Assembly Meetings this no cost survey opportunity was discussed, and in April a motion was made, voted on and passed for St. John's Lutheran Church, Pekin to take advantage of it.

CADDs is simple, straight forward, non-intrusive, and does not require anyone from outside the congregation to assist in the assessment. It relies on input from the people who know our congregation and context best... us.

CADDs uses a scientifically-developed 95 question survey to measure three critical elements of congregational well-being. The survey is designed to be completed by any and all members of the congregation and other people with an interest in the congregation (i.e. non-member school families, visitors, etc.).

There will be an informational meeting in the church basement Saturday, October 4th at 10 am to share more information and answer any questions that the congregation may have prior to the survey being administered 10/12/2025-11/2/2025.

The survey is completed online (an offline option is available) and takes about 20-25 minutes to complete. Offline options to complete the survey will also be available on Saturday, October 11th and Saturday, October 18th while waiting for photo shoots for the church directory.

Once the survey is closed, it will take about 2 weeks before getting the results which will be presented as a single-page graphical report sent directly to our congregation not shared with any other entity. The purpose of the CADDs report is to assist us with understanding the factors driving our stage of development or decline in order to identify which *re: Vitality* resources would be most beneficial to our congregation.

The *re: Vitality* suite of resources (also available at no cost to us) includes practical and productive training workshops that address serving inactive members, consensus-based strategic planning for our congregation, and how to share the Gospel with our community through effective outreach.
